Contextualization of the subject

Contribution to the professional profile of the degree

Moreover, this subject will help future graduates achieve a good communicative competence in English Language and be able to know and apply the appropriate methodological tools and strategies for teaching English in both Early Childhood and Primary Education.

The theoretical and practical contents of this subject will enable students to achieve a historical and present outline of the basic principles regarding the teaching of English as a second language in both Infant and Primary Education.
