#### Subject Contextualization

### Contribution to the profesional profile of the degree

The subject English for Education I provides students with a basic and instrumental knowledge of the English language. Working on the four skills, the subject aims at reviewing students' prior knowledge of English and reinforcing initial fluency. Moreover, this subject will help future graduates achieve a good communicative competence in English language and be able to know and apply the appropriate methodological tools and strategies for teaching English in Early Childhood Education. English for Education I is a compulsory subject in the degree of Foreign Language Teaching (English) in the Degree of Early Childhood Education.
