Contextualization of the subject

Contribution to the professional profile of the degree

A characteristic of the Grade in Business Administration is its general nature. And a clear reflection of this is the extraordinary breadth of professional activities that this profile can access. From this perspective, professional practice demands from the students the challenge of knowing how to contribute with their effort and with their knowledge in contexts where they will inevitably be faced with dilemmas and ethical implications in their professional decisions, which will not only affect them personally, but also have consequences beyond their own lives.

To deal with these situations, a mere ethical sensitivity is not enough, since that is sometimes just translated into valuations resulting from mere uncritical subjective intuitions. On the contrary, today's professionals must be able to perceive the ethical implications of the situations they encounter and the consequences that can be derived from their decisions, to be able to assume them responsibly. And of course this has to be done from the perspective of a rational and wellfounded justification of their ethical criteria and assessment.

For all these reasons, together with the specific training of their respective specialties, it is essential that the future professional is trained



to know how to deal with the ethical implications of its activity.in a solvent and responsible manner.

In-class Methodology: Activities

Would be:

- Master Classes: The teacher, using the master class methodology, will offer a theoretical and conceptual framework of the discipline and of each topic, highlighting the aspects and fundamental elements for its understanding.
- Analysis of Issues and Cases: In some of the sessions situations or issues will be analyzed that allow the application of aspects indicated in the theory and that favor the development of argumentative capacity, analysis, synthesis and development of moral reasoning.
- Analysis of Issues and Cases in groups: Analogous to the previous one, but carried out in small groups groups to facilitate more intense dialogue among students.
- Presentations of Cases prepared by students individually or in groups, within or out of the classroom.

Ratings

- The average grade with works, cases or reports will be taken only when the final exam is approved (minimum grade to pass: 5.00). If you fail the exam, the subject will be graded with your grade.
- Incurring a serious academic offense, such as plagiarism of previously published materials or copying the exam or other activity evaluated, may be penalized with the opening of a disciplinary file and the loss of the calls that the faculty regulations establish.
- In written assignments, a Turnitin indicator greater than 30% will require justification.
- Improper use of ChatGPT, or any other IAG, by students will be considered a serious offense, according to the General Regulations of the University, art. 168.2.e: "carrying out actions aimed at falsifying or defrauding the security systems evaluation of academic performance". The consequences of this may be "temporary expulsion of up to three months or prohibition of taking the exam in the next call for the imposition of the sanction, in one or several subjects of which the student is enrolled, [...] apart from assuming a failure grade (0) in the respective subject, [...] [and] the prohibition of taking the exam for that subject in the next call."
- Unjustified absence from more than a third of the class sessions may imply the loss of the right to take an exam in the calls that the faculty regulations establish (art. 93.1 of the General Regulations).
- Failure to attend the first hour of a double class will imply the application of absence to the entire session, regardless of whether the student attends, or not, the second hour.
- The teacher must specify the attendance control system at the beginning of the course.
- Cases, papers or reports delivered after the deadline will be considered undelivered.
- Failure to deliver, present or carry out cases, assignments, reports, or exercises will result in failure (zero) in the corresponding qualification.
- In the event of failing the course in the ordinary session, the grades for assignments, cases, reports or exercises provided for in this teaching guide and submitted in the ordinary session may be applied for the extraordinary grade. In such a case, the student must only complete the assignments, cases, reports or exercises that were failed or not submitted.
- For own students who are on exchange abroad and must take the subject exam, or in any other case in the event that class



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attendance is not required, the grading system will consist only of a final theoretical exam on the contents that the teacher determines. In these cases the final grade will be the grade obtained in the exam.

- In the case of exchanges (Out), it is the student's responsibility to contact the teacher in advance to specify the contents that can be examined.
- Unless expressly stated otherwise, in all calls the exams, assignments and exercises of any type must have a grade of at least 5.00 out of 10.00 to pass.
