COURSE SPECIFICS

Context of the course

Summary

Master's Final Dissertation is a personal project in which students must demonstrate mastery of a subject and know how to organize it, structure it and present it, according to the characteristics of an academic or scientific work specification. The topic must be relevant and located in the field of international migration.

The development of the subject has three fundamental moments: the delivery of a research proposal (chosen theme, provisional index and basic bibliography), the deposit of work to master and his public defense.

Competences – Goals

- CB-1 To gain knowledge in different topics of migration. Students must support in advanced readings and texts about human mobility and international migrations.
- CB_02 To be able to apply and integrate their knowledge in the field of human mobility and international migration, to understand these issues and its scientific basis. Students must develop their troubleshooting capabilities in new environments don't define specifically, in multidisciplinary contexts with researchers and highly specialized professionals.
- CB-03- To be able to manage adequate information, searching and analysing different data sources. To know synthesise and analyse relevant data to make judgments that include reflection on relevant



issues about social, scientific or ethical topics, related to the field of human mobility and international migration.
