Contextualization of the subject

Contribution to the professional profile of the degree

European integration and globalization are matters of great importance related to the linguistic and communicative competences of the English language. The subject **English and its Pedagogy I** provides students with a basic and instrumental knowledge of the English language. Working on the four skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing), the subject aims at reviewing students' prior knowledge of English and reinforcing initial fluency. The level of competence to be achieved by the students as regards the four skills will range from B1 to B2. Moreover, this subject will help future graduates achieve a good communicative competence in English language and be able to know and apply the appropriate

methodological tools and strategies for teaching English in both Early Childhood and Primary Education.



Consequently, students' professional profile will fit into the European foreign language teacher profile.

The theoretical and practical contents of this subject will enable students to achieve a historical and present outline of the basic principles regarding the teaching of English as a second language in both Infant and Primary Education.

Prerequirements

There are no official prerequisites for this subject. However, an intermediate level of written and oral English is strongly recommended; that is, level B1 according to the Common European Framework for Reference of Languages
