Course overview

This course is an introduction to the basic concepts in probability and statistics with engineering applications. Topics include probability, discrete and continuous random variables, confidence interval estimation, hypothesis testing, correlation, regression, and analysis of variance.

Prerequisites

Basic knowledge of Calculus and being able to answer the following questions correctly:

- 1) Compute: $\int_a^a F(x)$.
- 2) Solve: $2x - 5 = -3$.
- 3) Solve: $5x^2 - 10x + 5 = 0$.
- 4) Use interval notation to write the solution: $2x^2 \leq 3x + 5$.
- 5) When a brown bear hibernates, its heart rate drops to 10 beats per minute, which is 20% of its normal value. Compute a brown bear's normal heart rate when not hibernating.
- 6) Solve: $2x + 3y = 15$
 - a. $x - 3y = 10$
- 7) Compute: $\int_0^1 3x$, interpret the result and obtain the same result but using no integrals!
- 8) Solve $\frac{2}{\sqrt{x}} \leq 0.1$ in terms of $x \geq$
