Resultados de Aprendizaje
<p>This course explores the transition from traditional warfare to modern hybrid war techniques, which operate in the ambiguous space between peace and armed conflict. Students will be introduced to the concept of grey zones, encompassing activities such as economic sabotage, influence operations, cyberattacks and disinformation campaigns.</p> <p>The course will focus on understanding campaigns by state and non-state actors that blend non-military and quasi-military tools to stay below the threshold of armed conflict. It will also examine how these unconventional warfare techniques integrate with traditional military force, threats, and hybrid strategies.</p> <p>Through case studies, students will analyse how new technologies are used in grey-zone operations to obscure categorisation, attribution, and detection, complicating effective responses. They will also identify the objectives and means of hybrid warfare, which are often tailored to exploit the vulnerabilities of the target state.</p>



By the end of this course, students will be able to:

1. Define hybrid wars and explain their distinction from traditional and conventional warfare.
2. Understand and analyse the concept of grey zones and the spectrum of hybrid activities.
3. Identify the tools, technologies, and strategies used in hybrid warfare by state and non-state actors.
4. Analyse the vulnerabilities of target states and how hybrid war strategies exploit them.

Evaluate real-world case studies to identify hybrid warfare tactics and propose response strategies.
